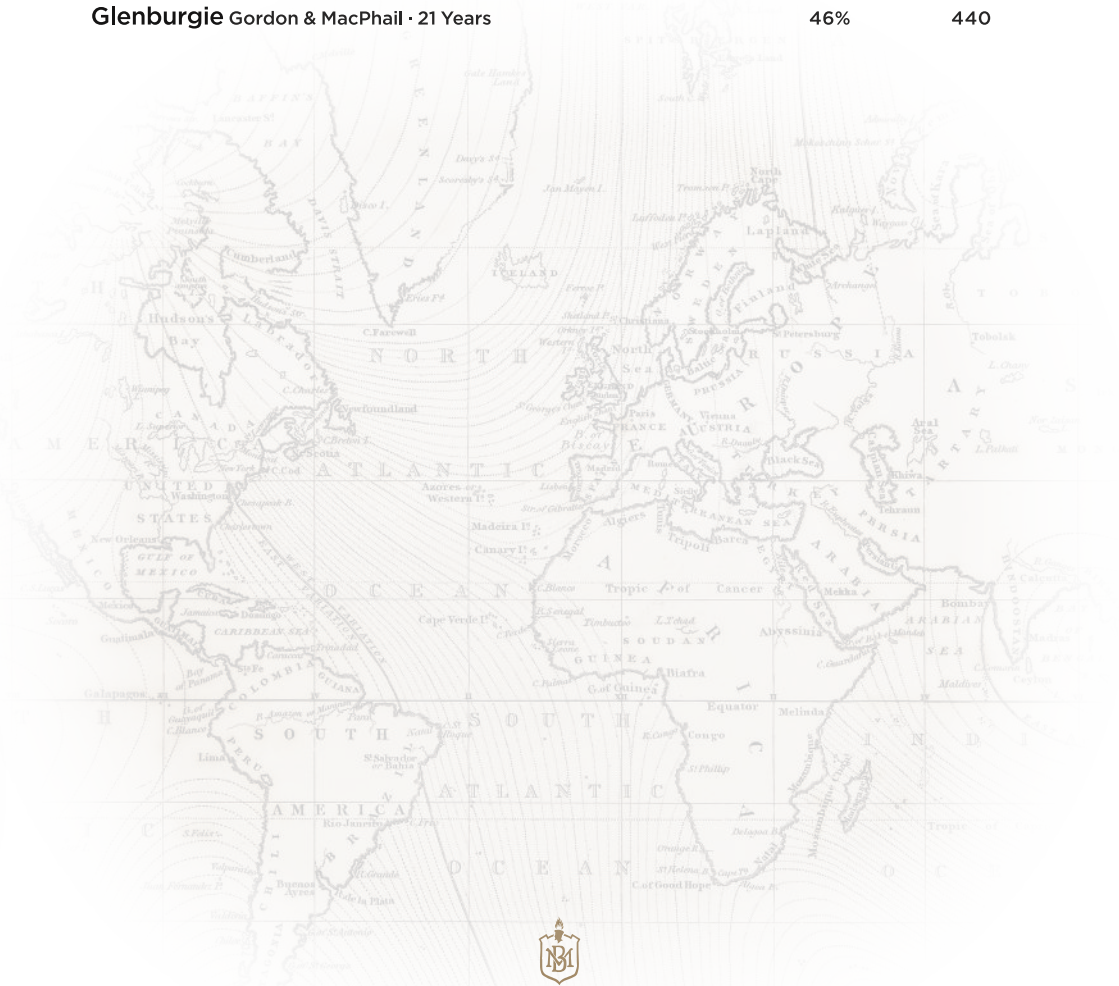

# JAPAN

Like Scotch, Japanese whisky tends to be drier, smokier, and peatier. Japanese whisky doesn't have a single flavor profile some bottles are peaty and earthy while others are more restrained and subdued. One aspect or overall guiding philosophy that characterizes Japanese whisky is a focus on perfection and a drive to constantly experiment, improve, and perfect their whisky.

## IRELAND, ENGLAND, WALES

The flavour profile of Welsh whisky often includes notes of fruit, vanilla, and spice, with a smooth and well-rounded finish, additional layers of flavour and complexity is added to the whisky by the finishing cask used.

There is a wide variety of styles and flavours available in English whisky depending on the use of peated and unpeated single malts, grains like rye or wheat and unusual cask types.

Irish whiskey has a distinct flavor profile described as light and fruity with evident cereal grain notes. Additional oakiness and caramel notes is achieved through additional aging.
